Eucharistic Adoration

What's it all about?

Like Mass, Adoration isn't necessarily about what we will get out of it. True, the graces dispensed by God help us grow in holiness, but the primary purpose of Adoration is right there in the name of the act: to adore the One present to us in the Eucharist.

Where:

In churches everywhere near you - available in many parishes at different days, times and formats. Some are open or available 24 hours, others are from morning until evening. NOTE: You can find times of Eucharist Adoration at masstimes.org by selecting Adoration.

How Just Be Still - During Adoration

Be Silent. Be still exteriorly and interiorly.

Be Attentive. It's not simply a reading hour — reading should be an entry-point to prayer.

Be Alert. Sit, stand, or kneel respectfully.

Remember that you don't actually have to do anything. The Catholic faith recognizes that the greatest gift God gives us is himself, and Adoration is another way for us to recognize that gift outside of receiving the Eucharist at Mass. So, don't overthink it. Just receive the gift.

Get rid of distractions:

If you are using your phone or electronic device to pray, silence the phone AND turn off pop-up notifications.

Bring a notepad. If something pops into your mind that you are worried about or don't want to forget later, write it down and then forget about it for the rest of your prayer time.

Focus on the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance or on the Crucifix - don't get distracted by others coming and going.

"Go and find Him when your patience and strength run out and you feel alone and helpless. Jesus is waiting for you in the chapel. Say to Him, 'Jesus, you know exactly what is going on. You are all I have, and you know all things. Come to my help.' And then go, and don't worry about how you are going to manage. That you have told God about it is enough. He has a good memory."

When Repeat as needed



Eucharistic Adoration can be helpful as part of your faith routine and you can make plans to attend at the same time and frequency every week. You can also go whenever you want to feel closer to Christ.

Suggested Prayers

Opening Prayer

Lord Jesus, You know my heart and love me in spite of my weaknesses. I ask you to bring me closer to you, and by your great love, free me from everything that separates me from you and your family - the Church. Thank you for your Holy presence, real and admirable in this Blessed Sacrament of your love - the Eucharist. Accept my prayer and let me hear your words. AMEN

Prayer to Saint Joseph

O, St. Joseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires. O, St. Joseph, do assist me by your powerful intercession, and obtain for me from your divine Son all spiritual blessings, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. So that, having engaged here below your heavenly power, I may offer my thanksgiving and homage to the most loving of Fathers.



Prayer from Angel of Peace to Children at Fatima (1916):

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love you! I beg pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love you!

Act of Spiritual Communion (at Adoration or when unable to receive Holy Communion)

Since I cannot receive You sacramentally at this moment, I ask you to come into my heart spiritually. I embrace You as if You were already there. I unite myself to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
